



What is Read to Succeed?

Tiffin City Schools' Read to Succeed program is a volunteer mentor reading program that allows for volunteer mentors to read individually with a student. This type of learning environment helps our students improve reading fluency and comprehension, vocabulary, and confidence.

No Special training or education background necessary!

Although an education related background is helpful, it is not necessary. Anyone can be a volunteer mentor if there is a desire to help our students become successful readers.

Requirements:

To follow our school policy, we do require all mentors to undergo fingerprinting and a background check, however, the United Way may be able to offset the cost if you qualify.

It's consistent, but flexible!

It is encouraged that volunteers maintain a consistent schedule; however, the schedule can be flexible if needed. The Read to Succeed program is designed for 30 minute sessions for each student. The volunteer has the freedom to decide the amount of time they volunteer in the program.
